



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS


For all Level 3 courses, you will need five GCSEs (or equivalent) at C/4 grade or above, including Mathematics, and English Language or Literature. For some courses there may be additional requirements, please refer to the individual course pages for details.

If you have concerns about achieving the grades then aim high and apply for the course you want to do. We will offer you guidance following your application to help you reach the destination you are working towards.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Standard entry requirements: You will need eight GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English Language, and Maths (grade 5).

Subject specific entry requirements or recommendations: Grade 6 in Biology and Chemistry, or equivalent.








Progression
