




Apprenticeships - Workbased

- You will need to get a job
- You will have a contract of employment for at least 30 hours per week.
- You earn a wage whilst gaining skills and qualifications
- 80% in the workplace and 20% in the classroom
- Assessment is ongoing and will take place both in the workplace and in the classroom.

What's the difference?

Undergraduate Degree	Higher / Degree Apprenticeship
Access to up to £9,535 per year tuition fee loan	All training is paid for by the government and the company you work for
Gain a level 6 qualification	Gain a level 4-7 qualification
Usually full-time study (some part-time options are available)	A minimum of 20% protected study time during contracted work hours
Apply through UCAS	Apply through employer
Unpaid (with access to bursaries, scholarships, grants and loans for additional support with costs)	Paid
Get the 'university experience'	Go straight into the world of work
Learn in lectures, seminars, group and independent study	Learn on the job

The Benefits

- Earn while you learn
- Gain nationally recognised qualifications
- All the benefits of being a paid employee, including paid holidays
- Gain soft skills that employers want
- Avoid tuition fees and student loans
- Supported by a dedicated tutor
- More workplace experience than other pathways

Things to Consider

- You must have secured a job/employer to start an apprenticeship
- Lower pay than a standard job sometimes
- Number of apprenticeships available varies by location
- Apprenticeships advertised on a rolling basis when vacancies become available
- Apprenticeships are competitive because anyone can apply, including existing employees
- Will not have the 'university experience' that many people value
- No access to student financial support

Apprenticeship to do list

- Use **UCAS**, **ASK** or **GOV.UK** to find an apprenticeship.
- Find and research companies who offer apprenticeships.
- Keep informed when apprenticeships are released.
- Ask for advice and guidance on writing a cover letter and CV.
