#### Debate Club: A Term of Big Ideas and Bigger Voices

This term has been an exciting one for our Debate Club, as students have embraced opportunities to speak up, think critically and engage with the world beyond the classroom. Every Tuesday after school in Room D3, Debate Club has been hard at work preparing for the Youth Speaks competition. Members have explored a wide range of thought-provoking topics, from "Graffiti: Art or Vandalism?" to "Films versus Books – Which Tells the Better Story?". These sessions have helped students develop persuasive arguments, confident delivery and the ability to see issues from multiple perspectives.

A few students have also taken their passion for debate into the political arena, by applying for the Youth Parliament programme. This initiative gives young people a voice in shaping policy and understanding democratic processes. Our club has supported applicants in crafting compelling statements and preparing for interviews, ensuring they feel ready to represent their peers on the national stage.

Finally, eight of our Year 11 students recently attended the Queens Model United Nations all-day conference, where they engaged in lively, topical political debates with peers from across the region. Representing different countries and viewpoints, our students tackled global issues with professionalism and enthusiasm, gaining invaluable experience in diplomacy and negotiation.

#### **RRSA Enrichment Day**

On Tuesday, all staff and students paused for the day for our Rights Respecting Schools Enrichment Day, considering Article 2 - Non-Discrimination.

In tutor groups, students explored why the UN wrote Human Rights in 1947. They considered what a world would be like if people didn't have





access to Human Rights.
Students evaluated why it took
until 1989 for the Convention on
the Rights of the Child (UNCRC)
to be written. Tutor groups
considered what improved for
young people under the
UNCRC. The session closed
with all tutor groups across the

school writing their own class charter using the UNCRC.

In the second session, we considered the attitude towards woman and girls by firstly understanding when the difference in roles came into light. Tutor groups considered what it means to be treated fairly and all tutor groups understood what the white ribbon promise means and they took the pledge if they wished.

It was wonderful as a school to step forward in our learning journey in understanding the integral importance of

belonging to a school which puts the convention of the Rights of the child up front and centre.

Students had the opportunity to listen to a band who put non-discrimination at the centre of the music, Runaway Club. It was wonderful to see students enjoy this experience.





All students throughout the day also considered the language they use and the negative impact it can have towards others.


