Introduction

We are excited to launch our Enrichment Days at Court Fields School. These are happening from Tuesday 14 July to Thursday 16 July 2026. This is a special part of our school calendar designed to broaden students' experiences and inspire their learning in new and exciting ways. These days allow pupils to step beyond their usual timetable and engage in activities that spark creativity, build confidence, and develop important life skills.

There are a number of themes that are available and your child will pick a theme that lasts for the three days. They also need to make a second choice if the first is not available. The themes are unable to be mixed because of staffing restrictions and costs. Some activities are designed to introduce them to new interests, while others offer opportunities to deepen skills they already enjoy. Above all, Enrichment Days are about encouraging curiosity, independence and fun.

We value your ongoing support in helping your children make the most of these opportunities. We hope they return home full of enthusiasm – ready to share what they've learned, created, and discovered. Thank you for being part of their learning journey. We're excited to see how these experiences will inspire their growth both in and beyond the classroom. This period is part of our school calendar and attendance is expected.

This booklet outlines the range of themes that are available. We have worked hard to offer a diverse selection of activities to suit a variety of interests and budgets.

We are sharing this information early to give families time to plan, save and where needed - pay in instalments. Please note that while we've done our best to provide accurate pricing, final costs may vary depending on group sizes and transport arrangements. Some activities will have limited spaces. If any are over subscribed, students will be selected randomly. Any students not successful will get their second choice. If for any reason this is also not possible then we will speak to the child individually.

Each theme requires a minimum number of students for it to go ahead. If this number is not met then your child will get their second choice. If for any reason this is also not possible then we will speak to the child individually.

We hope every student finds something that excites and motivates them and we can't wait to see this new tradition take shape.

What to do next

Please take the time to read through this booklet carefully before helping your child make their selection. You need to need to make their choice by 23 February using the online form for their Year Group. Please ensure this has been discussed with your child. Once the selection process is complete, you will receive an email to confirm which activity your child will be doing. You will then be able to make the payment on Scopay. Further information for each theme will be sent out nearer the time. Once places are confirmed they are unable to be changed.



Thrillseeker Theme - Year 10



We are organising an exciting overnight residential trip to Alton Towers Resort just for our Year 10 students. This visit aims to provide pupils with a memorable combination of recreation, independence and valuable learning experiences outside the classroom. We are hoping that if this is successful then it will be offered to Year 10s in the future.

Alton Towers is the UK's leading theme park, offering over 40 rides and attractions, including a wide selection of major rollercoasters such as Galactica, Nemesis, Oblivion, Rita, The Smiler, and Wicker Man—all of which offer thrilling experiences suitable for older pupils.

Students will stay overnight at the Alton Towers Resort Hotel. They will be provided with an evening meal and breakfast in the morning. They will need to purchase their lunches for both days. All pupils will be supervised at all times by experienced school staff who will remain on-site throughout the visit.

- Return travel to school - leave Alton Towers at 16.00


16 July

This cost of this theme will be £155. The deposit of £55 will be payable by 2 March. The next £50 payable by 1 April and final payment of £50 by 1 May.



Drama Theme



We are excited to be able to offer a day trip to London to watch Hercules at the Theatre Royal, Drury Lane. We will leave school by coach in the morning to watch the matinee and return by the evening. The children will need a packed lunch.

The cost of this theme will be £52. The deposit of £25 will be payable by 2 March and the final payment of £27 is payable by 1 April.



Environmental Theme



We are organising a day trip to Noah's Ark Zoo to to learn about a range of wildlife including African Elephants, Rhino, Lemurs and Capybara. They will also be able to experience a tractor-ride safari as part of this trip and take part in a workshop to meet some on the animals.

A day investigating the local environment including wildlife surveys, habit maintenance and pond dipping.

15 July

A day of habitat creation including building bird boxes and garden-based activities.

16 July

A trip to Noah's Ark Zoo.

The cost of this theme will be £25. This will be payable on 2 March.



Detective Theme



Step into the English department and find yourself in the middle of a thrilling whodunnit, where every clue matters and every student becomes a detective. Our murder-mystery themed activity is a gripping investigation filled with secret motives, hidden evidence, and unexpected twists. Whether you're cracking codes, solving riddles and clues or piecing together the final reveal, you'll be right at the heart of the action. Bring your sharpest instincts, your boldest theories, and a friend or two—you won't want to miss the chance to solve the case before time runs out.

If you think of yourself as a budding detective - the next Sherlock Holmes or Hercule Poirot then this is the activity for you! Over the three days, you will develop your problem solving skills, crack codes, and solve crimes using CSI techniques like fingerprinting and footprint analysis, as well as watching a selection of murder mystery films before heading into Exeter to complete an escape room.

14 July

In school cracking codes and riddles. Taking part in an escape room style puzzle. Cracking the mystery of "The Case of the Clockwork Cleaner." Watching a mystery film.

15 July

CSI: Matching the footprint to the show, handwriting analysis, fingerprint analysis. Cracking the mystery of "Murder by the Book". Watching a mystery film.

16 July

Day trip to Exeter to complete an escape room and a treasure hunt around the city centre.

The cost of this theme is approximately £50. The deposit of £25 will be payable by 2 March and the final payment of £25 is payable by 1 April.



Wellbeing Theme



Step into a few days focusing on wellbeing giving yourself time to reflect and bring that sense of calm into the everyday. Our wellbeing theme is a dedicated time, for students to focus on their mental, physical, and emotional health through activities like mindfulness, fitness, yoga workshops, yoga Nidra, sound healing, nature walk, art or simply rest, aiming to gain a healthier balance life.

If you think you would like to spend time improving your own wellbeing, then this is the activity for you.

14 July.

This will include amongst other things a Yoga workshop, a sound healing workshop, playing pickleball and watching a film in school.

15 July.

This will include amongst other things an art workshop, carrying out random acts of kindness, a nature walk, a Yoga Nidra workshop and watching a film in school.

16 July.

Trip into Wellington to go to the cinema and a local café.

The cost of this theme is approximately £15. This is payable by 2 March.



Creative Theme



Get ready – our performing arts mural project is in the pipeline to turn an ordinary wall into an explosion of music, movement, and pure imagination! Sporting Theme

The sporting theme will consist of multisport activities in school for two days. On the third day the students can choose a trip to either Butlins Theme Park or Crealy Theme Park.

The multisports will include a range of team games, racket sports such as tennis, pickleball and badminton and other individual activities.

The cost of this theme will be approximately £30. The deposit of £15 will be payable by 2 March and the final payment of £15 is payable by 1 April.



Outdoor Theme



This will be a great opportunity to take part in a number of outdoor activities such as campfire cooking, building shelters, gardening, making bug hotels, bat boxes and a musical forest school. We will also do some foraging, nature crafts, learn some navigation skills and do a scavenger hunt. In addition there will be a local walk which will incorporate a picnic or stop at a local café.

14 July - 16 July

There will be no cost for this theme (apart from the café).

1. **Why are costs approximate?** This is because final costs may vary slightly depending on group sizes, transport arrangements or provider availability. Parents/carers will be notified of any changes to costs.
2. **How are students selected if a theme is oversubscribed?** Students will be selected on a randomly picked system. If students do not get their first choice, they will be offered their second choice.
3. **What are the expectations of behaviour?** Students are expected to follow the school's behaviour policy at all times. This is essential to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for everyone. All places are subject to good attendance and behaviour, and we reserve the right to withdraw a student if these criteria are not met.
4. **What measures are in place to ensure the safety of students and staff?** All activities are risk-assessed and led by qualified staff or providers. Emergency procedures, ratios and safeguarding protocols are in place to ensure safety throughout the days.
5. **What are the steps after submitting the theme choice online?** Students will be allocated to their first choice of theme where possible. You will then be sent an email with confirmation and details of when to pay, if applicable. If for any reason they are unable to have their first choice they will be offered their second choice.
6. **Is any financial assistance available?** If your child currently receives pupil premium funding, then it may be possible to provide financial support towards the cost of the activity. If this is the case and you would like to be considered for such support, please tick the box on the consent form above.
7. **What happens if I do not complete the form by the deadline?** Your child will be placed into a school based theme.
8. **Can my child change their choice?** Once a choice of theme has been confirmed, changes cannot be made except in exceptional circumstances or where a clear replacement is available.
9. **What does my child need to wear?** All activities are non-uniform. This does need to be appropriate. Some activities may require certain clothing. You will be informed of this nearer the time.
