Message from Mrs Matthews

I can't believe that we're already at the end of Term 5, just 7 school weeks away from the end of this academic year. We have achieved so much in the last 12 months: a successful Ofsted Monitoring Visit and Teacher Assessed Grades last summer, developments to our curriculum to help students know more and remember more, transition and welcoming our fantastic Year 7s, returning to clubs, trips and visits, and recently this year's formal Year 11 exam series, recruiting Transition Leaders and Prefects.

Just in the last week three examples have shown me how far we have come. Year 11 students in their droves arriving for before and after school revision sessions, and displaying such a focus and commitment in their exams. Students in History and English lessons I visited intently discussing democracy and the importance of the vote,



with reference to women's suffrage and the inequality inherent in a range of contemporary texts and those from the canon of literature. Thirdly this week, having the privilege of conducting Prefect Interviews with Year 10, using a 'goldfish bowl' exercise where students are observed discussing and creating an action plan in response to a given scenario. Topics such as developing engagement in reading, supporting transition and increasing uptake of languages at Key Stage 4 were addressed with strategic thought and clarity that made us feel so proud of our fantastic students.
