Culture: The way we live, the clothes we wear, gods we worship, it is what makes groups of people who they are

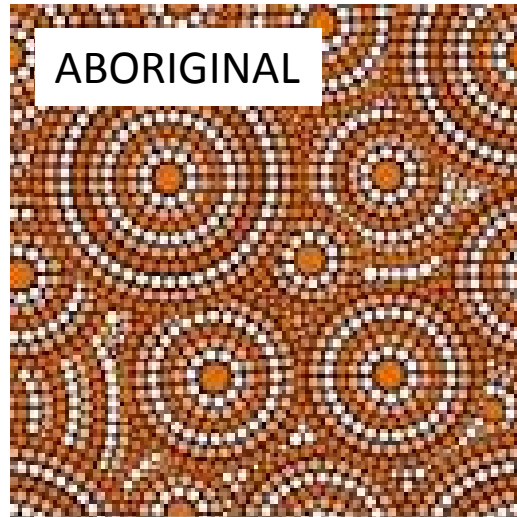
Pattern: The use of shapes to create a new image that often repeats

Symbolic: An image that means something in a culture e.g. The cross in Christianity represents the Death of Christ

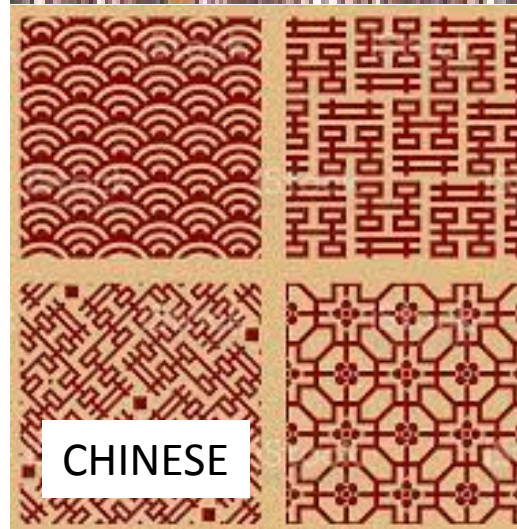
Different cultures use pattern to illustrate their fabrics for clothing and textiles. We will look at 4 different styles of cultural pattern



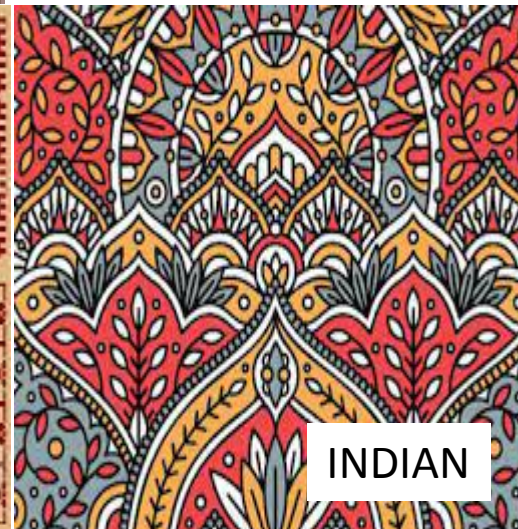

POLY PRINTING



Poly printing is a similar form of printing as lino printing. It is when you carve a design into a polystyrene sheet and use ink to print the design. The differences are the poly sheet is soft and easy to carve with a pencil whereas the lino needs a specialist tool to carve it away and is much more difficult
