

### Entry requirements

Level 3 courses: 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above

Level 2 courses: 5 GCSEs at grade 3 or above

Level 1 courses: 4 GCSEs at grade 2 or above





Level 3

Entry requirements: 6 GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English and Maths

Progress straight into work, an apprenticeship, or university





Combination of employment and training

Industry employment is essential



Entry requirements vary – set by employer




