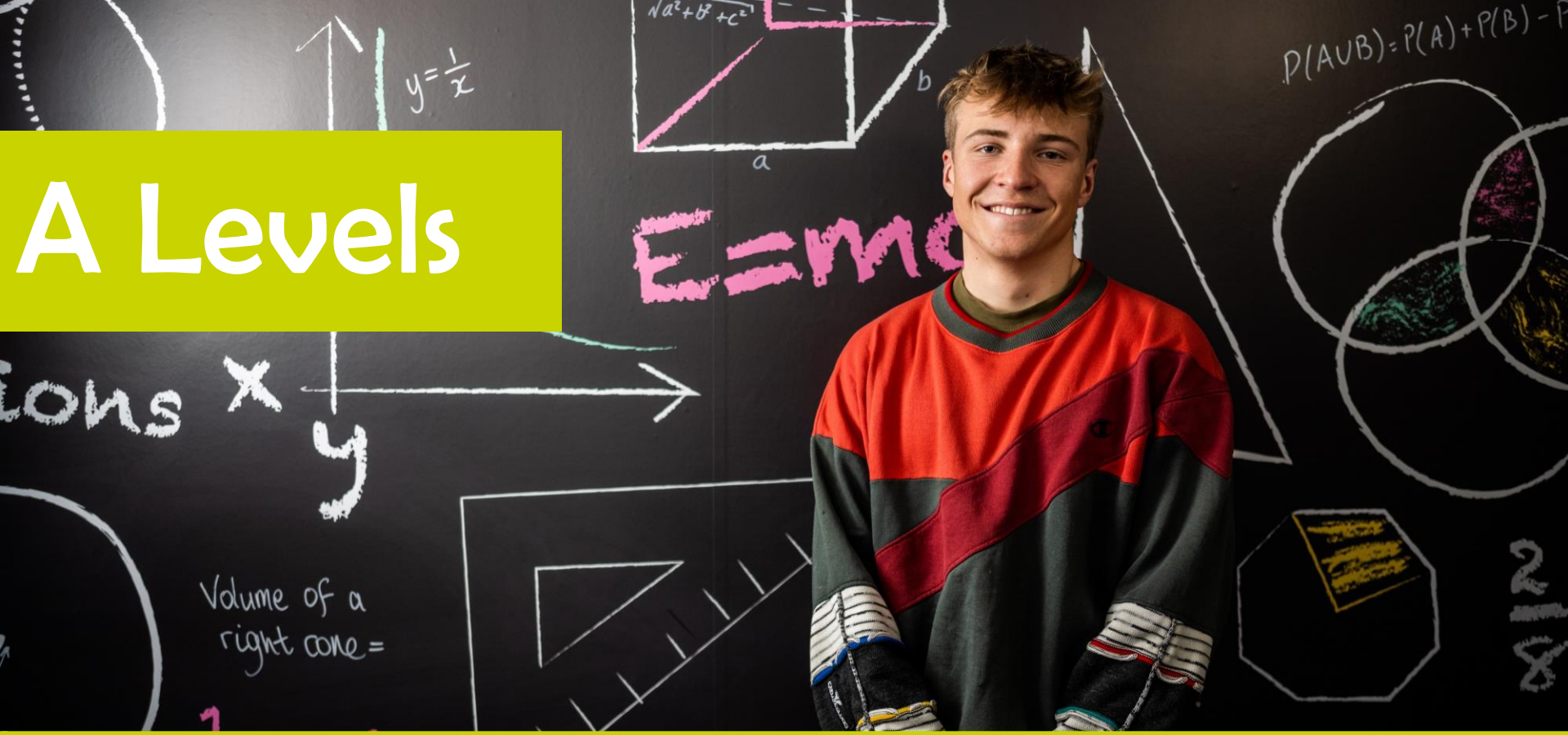

# Entry requirements

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Level 3 courses: **5** GCSEs at grade **4** or above

Level 2 courses: **5** GCSEs at grade **3** or above

Level 1 courses: **4** GCSEs at grade **2** or above



# T - Levels

## Level 3

**Entry requirements:** 6 GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English and Maths

**Progress straight into work, an apprenticeship, or university**

**Entry requirements vary – set by employer**



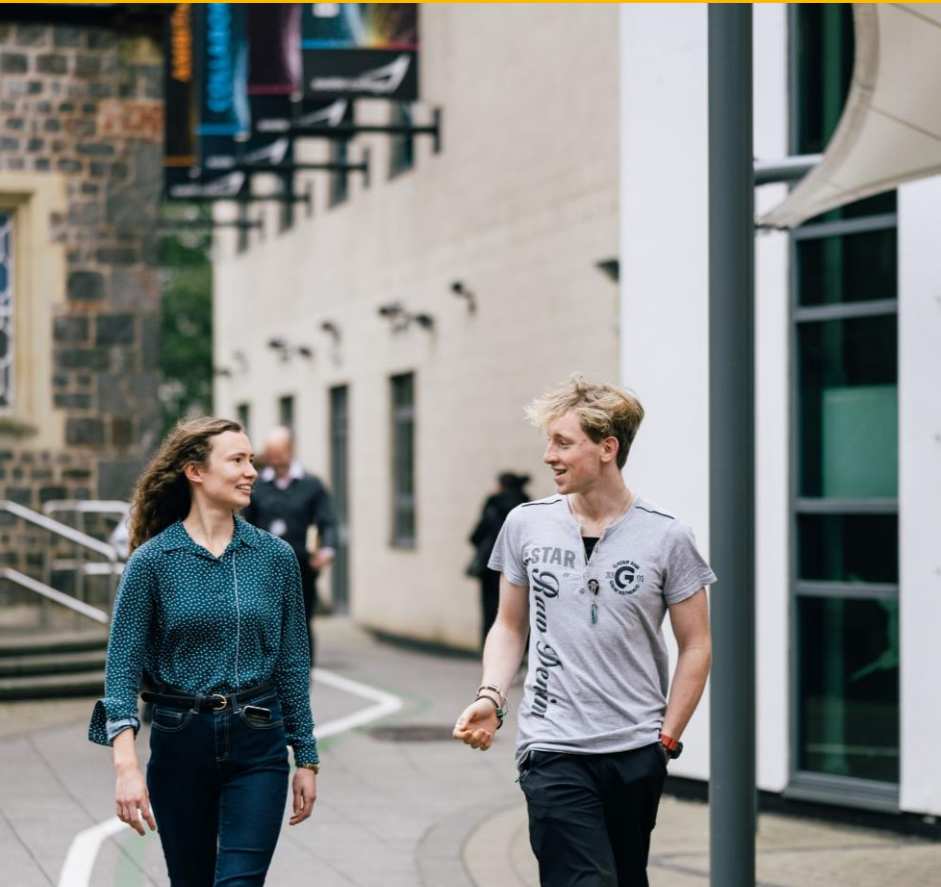
