

House System

Why a house system?





• A house system promotes peer relationships that can develop more successfully along with the fostering of a special community feeling.

• Another feature of house systems is the competition between houses. For example, the traditional school sports day is usually an inter-house competition. Debating competitions and charity fundraising events are also often organised along inter-house lines. Points can be awarded for behaviour and academic achievement and may also be totalled up for comparison between houses in a House Cup award given at the end of the academic year.

• Court Fields School shall have a year-long programme of inter-house events, in which each house competes, with points contributing to the award of the House Cup at the end of the year. Along with other aspects of student performance.

• One notable feature of the house system is the appointment of *house captains*, and possibly other house leadership roles, who exercise a role of responsibility with limited authority within the house and assist in the organisation of activities.
