Introduction

PPE Results

The 2nd PPE exam results will be emailed to parents and students on **Monday 27th March**. Please do make sure we have your most up to date email address and that your child can access their school email. If you have any issues with email please do contact our IT support at support@courtfields.net

Staff have been asked not to share these exam results until **Monday 27th March** to make sure teachers have

adequate time to mark and moderate papers accurately. Teachers will be providing feedback and preparing students for their final GCSE exams before this date and will then discuss the grades with students in the final week of this term.

There is a final opportunity to speak to teachers at Parent Evening on Thursday 30th March and we would strongly recommend you make appointments for this evening. This will be a face to face evening and will provide parents with a valuable opportunity to talk to teachers.

Exam Timetable

The GCSE Examinations Timetable for this year is available on our school website here: <https://www.courtfields.net/exams.htm>. This shows all of the exams that students will be taking this summer. Students will be provided with a copy of their 'statement of entry' before Easter and this shows students all of the exams that they have been entered for including the dates of each exam.

When we come back after Easter students will be emailed a personalised exam timetable like the one they received for their PPE exams. This timetable clearly shows the key information that students will need to prepare including exam, date, start time, length of exam, room and seat number.

Leavers' Information

The last official day students are expected on site from 8.40am until 3.10pm is Friday 26th May. Once the exams begin in May, and until the 26th May, students are expected to be in the exams or in lessons.

We will not authorise students to return home after the exams finish each day, unless specifically advised by Mr Dudley in advance to parents, as it is vital they still attend lessons for final revision support.

Please avoid making any appointments for Year 11 students during the school day in the exam period, as they must be able to take advantage of every lesson that they have left so that they are effectively prepared for their exams.

From Monday 5th June students will only be expected in school for:

- Timetabled exams or revision sessions

A full programme will be published closer to the time.

To celebrate our students' 5-year journey, we will be providing opportunities to celebrate on our official leavers event that will take place on Friday 16th June. All students will attend the Science Exam in that morning. Students taking Geography will have an exam at 1:10pm. Following this exam at approx. 2:45pm we will be providing all students with:

- A chance to sign shirts and say goodbyes
- The Leavers Assembly led by Mr Nicholls

We will then hold a celebratory BBQ on the school site for students, parents, staff and invited community guests following the assembly on the 16th June.

Preparation for Exams

Over the coming weeks we would expect all students to be revising regularly and for longer in order to fully prepare for the final exams. In Tutor Time this week all students have been issued with a revision handbook containing helpful tips and advice in structuring revision over the coming weeks. This also contains a revision timetable, which your child will be completing, showing which subjects they will be revising each evening and the revision sessions they will be attending in school. Your support in ensuring that your child sticks to this timetable and completes revision each day will be invaluable in ensuring they achieve the grades they deserve.

We would recommend that students spend at least 3 hours each day on revision. There are revision sessions held in school each afternoon, and B1 is available to students to use for quiet revision in school on Thursday. The revision timetable is at the end of this letter. Please do encourage your child to attend and use this time productively to prepare for their exams.

The following strategies are highly recommended for students to support in their revision:

- Use of the 'look/cover/write/check' technique to learn subject specific vocabulary
- Use of flashcards and mind-maps to learn key concepts and theories
- Practice exam responses and use of mark schemes to self assess.

There are also a variety of revision resources available online such as BBC Bitesize, Hegarty Maths and SENECA learning, and revision guides are available for each subject to purchase via our website.

Your child has been provided with topic lists for each subject to help students know what is expected of them in the exam and what topics to target for their revision.



Over the coming weeks teachers and students should use the recent PPEs to RAG rate each of these topics to further support your child in identifying what is most in need of revision and those topics that require a light touch. In preparation for the 2nd PPEs.

Year 11 Prom

Prom is one of our favourite times of the year. We are pleased to have secured The Allerford Inn again, following our previous very successful Proms there.

The Prom will take place on Friday 7th July, arrivals from 6.30pm.

The Allerford gives our students the unique experience to celebrate their time at Court Fields with friends, Year group

peers and staff. Parents/Families are welcome to come and see the arrivals, take photos and share in the celebrations. All students will be expected inside the venue and families departed by 7.30pm. The event finishes at 11.30pm. Full details of arrival times, routes and how to purchase tickets will be shared after half term.

Ticket prices are £34 and this includes a welcome drink upon arrival, food, entertainment, fireworks, and awards ceremony. Soft drinks and mocktails will be able to be purchased from the bar throughout the evening. We have kept the ticket price as low as possible, despite inflation, with only a £2 increase on the 2021 price, as we are aware of the impacts of the current financial situation on our parents.

All students currently have a place at Prom, but we must stress this place will be dependent on behaviour and attendance over the coming weeks. For a very small number of students this place is currently at risk, and their parents will have received a letter explaining this, and the improvements their child needs to make. Attendance to Prom is a privilege and the final decisions will be made by SLT and Mr Nicholls. We would like all our students to be able to attend, so we are sure all our Year 11s will continue to work hard, show maturity and commitment to their studies following the Easter break and exam period.

We would like all our students to have the opportunity to celebrate their achievements and their journey at secondary school with us and their peers.
